Incident Summary:

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) continues to monitor the evolving Coronavirus Disease, also known as COVID-19, situation closely. CISA is taking part in interagency and industry coordination calls and working with critical infrastructure partners to prepare for possible disruptions to critical infrastructure that may stem from widespread illness.

FEMA reports approximately 22,256,220 (+263,601) cases and 782,456 (+6,554) deaths worldwide. In the U.S. there are approximately 5,506,929 (+46,500) cases and 172,416 (+1,404) deaths.

CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPACTS:

HEALTHCARE AND PUBLIC HEALTH

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) halted emergency authorization for a blood plasma treatment for COVID-19 after federal health officials intervened, citing inconclusive data.

Alabama is transferring patients from hospitals near max capacity to hospitals with more available space.

On 18 Aug California announced the removal of San Diego County from its watch list for reporting three consecutive days an average rate of less than 100 new cases per 100,000 residents. The positivity rate fell to 4.2 percent.

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) reported new out breaks of the novel coronavirus at multiple Colorado restaurants, a church, a hotel and a rural fair.

Following an increase in cases among younger people, the Florida Department of Health changed reporting on

children. Pediatric cases will now report individuals under 18 years of age, the previous age range was 0-24 years. The state will no longer report the number of hospitalized children.

The Chicago Department of Public Health announced on 18 Aug the states of Iowa and Kansas were again added to the city's travel quarantine list, Wisconsin was removed. Travelers are required to quarantine as positive case numbers trend higher.

The Louisiana governor's office announced 18 Aug a positivity rate of 9.4 percent, dropping the state to the "yellow zone".

ACTIVATIONS AND DECLARATIONS

The Governor of Georgia issued an executive order on August 15 renewing restrictions on large gatherings and a shelter-in-place order for high-risk residents.

Honolulu Mayor announced an "Act Now Honolulu – No Social Gatherings" directive effective August 19. Under this directive no indoor/outdoor gatherings larger than 5 people are allowed for the next 28 days including at restaurants, homes, and in recreational/commercial boating. Spiritual services are no longer permitting the playing of wind instruments and singing and should maintain constant face coverings. Face covering is required for those visiting indoor/outdoor malls and businesses should reduce on-site employee numbers, suspend lunch room and gathering area usage.
